



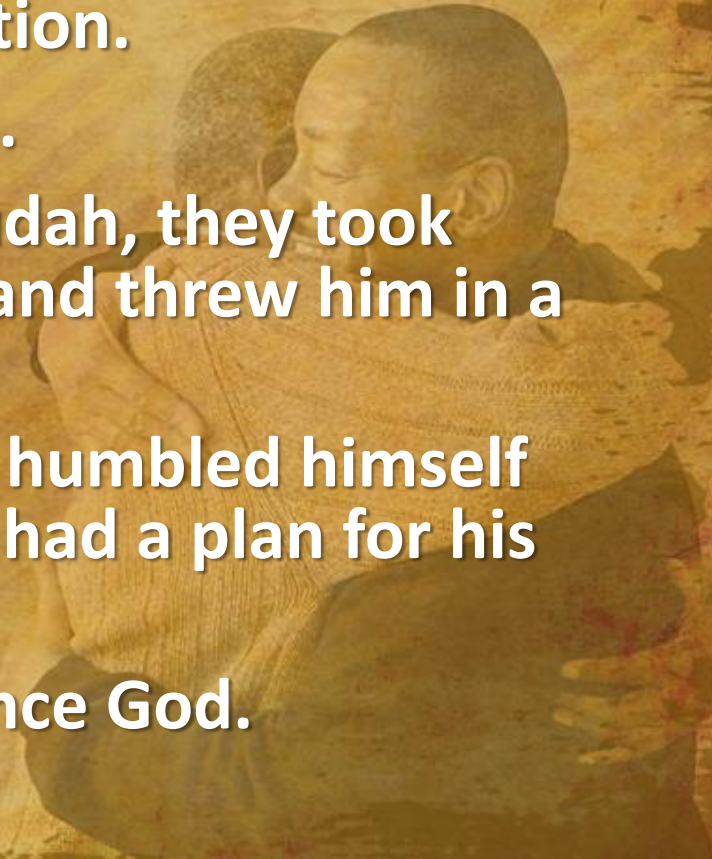
# A Second Chance God

# King Manasseh

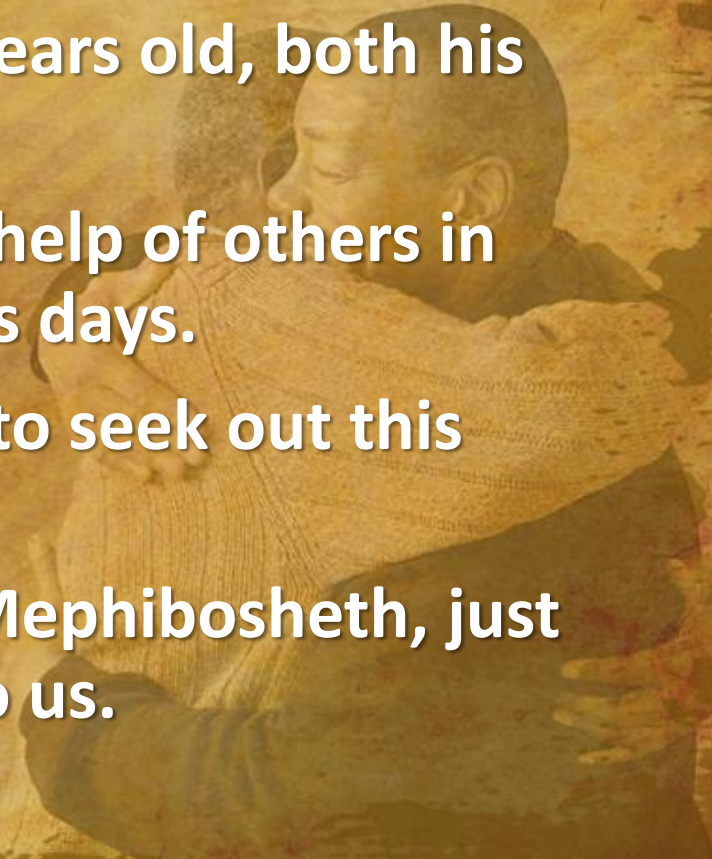
- King Manasseh was Judah's longest reigning king.
