Special Revelation

- To the Jews, God's chosen people, special revelation was given.
- We also have God's special revelation in that we have His Word in our hand.
- We should remember the following facts:
 - We are capable of committing sin.

 - Committing a sin of thought is like actually committing the sin.

Morality

- God judges according to the truth.

- We should not act as holier than the rest of the world; rather we should be humbled that God considered us.

Humility

- As God reveals our sins and shortcomings, we must ask Him for forgiveness.
