# God's Love

- We tend to gloss over what Jesus did for us on the cross.
- We have no power within ourselves to save us from the wrath that is to come.
- There is nothing in us that rates God owing us a pardon.
- Jesus died in our place.
- God showed how much He loved us because we were still sinners.



# What Jesus Did For Us

- The words “justified” and “reconciled” are vital to understanding our salvation.
- To justify is to “declare righteous;” it’s the judicial or legal portion of our salvation.
- Reconciliation is the relational side of our salvation.
- Jesus is the propitiation (atoning Sacrifice) for our sins.
- We are saved from God’s wrath in our future.
- God no longer views us as guilty, rebellious, and condemned sinners.



# We Are Saved By Jesus' Life

- We are saved by His life as He sits at the right hand of the Father.
- Jesus is our advocate, our defense lawyer, while He sits at the right hand of the Father.
- Satan accuses us before God day and night.
- Jesus defends us by saying He has already paid the price as the propitiation for our sins.
- We have a relationship with God through Jesus Christ, His Son.
