- **God never rejected Israel; Israel is the one who rejected God.**
- **Israel cannot revoke God's mercy or His call to them as a nation.**
- **The Bible declares that all of Israel will be saved and Jesus Christ will turn away their ungodliness.**
- **God committed Israel to disobedience so He might have mercy on them.**
- **God has not rejected Israel but has a plan for them.**
