- Daniel wanted to remember that he was one of the chosen people of God.
- If ungodly people are immoral or have different values, they are living in a way that is consistent with who they are.
- When we take a stand, we need to be wise about how we do it so we do not come across as self-righteous or arrogant.

We Need To Excel In The Environment In Which We Live

- Daniel and his friends knew more about Babylonian religion and culture than most Babylonians.
- God helped Daniel and his friends excel in the pagan culture of Babylon.
- Christians should excel in learning, with well-rounded information, and opinions that are carefully developed and not based on lies.
- In work or business, Christians should shine light on shady dealings and dark atmospheres.
- Christians should be known for their service in and to the community.
