Leave It with God

Psalm 18:2, "The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge."

Perched high on the climbing wall, Sarah could feel panic rising as her weakening fingers began losing grip on the handholds. "Just how hard will I hit the ground," she wondered.

But the instructor kept calling out assurances from below. As the "belayer" tethered to the other end of the rope tied to Sarah's harness through a pulley, his weight would hold her if she fell. "I'm much heavier than you!" he yelled. "Just let go."

So she did—and simply swung away from the wall to dangle safely in the air.

The incident gave Sarah a new perspective of the picture of God in Psalm 18:2: "The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock . . . my stronghold." Sarah observed, "God is so much heavier than all my problems. I can let go of my worries and fears, and He'll catch me."

King David sang the words of Psalm 18 after God rescued him from "deep waters"—these were his "powerful [enemies]" looking to bring about his "day of . . . disaster" (vv. 16-18). Even if his troubles didn't disappear, he knew he could trust his all-powerful Savior and that God was holding on to him tightly.

Samaritan's Purse currently works in more than 100 countries to provide aid to victims of war, disease, disaster, poverty and famine.

The Samaritan's Purse project, OCC, collects shoebox gifts filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items—and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received.

Since 1993, OCC, the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, has collected and delivered more than 232 million shoebox gifts to children in more than 170 countries and territories.

Delivered into the hands of children through local churches in their area, every shoebox gift is an opportunity to share about Jesus Christ and God's love. Since 2009 over 46 million shoebox recipients have participated in their 12-lesson discipleship course, The Greatest Journey. More than 23 million boys and girls have made decisions for Christ.

Matthew 14:22-33

Jesus Revealed

- •The disciples were being battered by the waves and the wind.
- •Jesus revealed Himself as they had never seen, known or understood Him before.
- •Water represented all the evil powers which oppressed and resisted the salvation intended for the people of Israel.
- •Jesus is doing something that only God alone can do.
- •This is not just about Jesus walking on the water, it is a divine revelation!

When We Wonder, We Can Trust Jesus

- •The words translated as "It is I" are the same words God used to reveal Himself to Moses at the burning bush.
- •Jesus' message to the disciples in the midst of the storm, "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid" gives us faith so we too can trust Je-SUS.
- •We live in a world that is ruled by fear.
- •When we wonder how we are going to make it through our situation, Jesus walks out to us, victoriously gliding across the things we fear most.

When We Feel Powerless, We Can Trust Jesus

- •When we feel powerless, we can trust Jesus.
- •Just as Jesus told Peter to leave the safety of

his boat and conquer his fears, He is telling us also to come with Him.

- Only when Peter became distracted, when fear got a grip on him again did he start to sink.
- •When we need help, we can trust Jesus.

Conclusion

- We are called by Jesus to step out of our comfort zones in faith.
- •If you want to be close to Jesus, you have to venture forth out on the sea, trusting and proving His promises.
- •Getting out of the boat with Jesus is the most risky, most exciting, and most fulfilling way to live life to the fullest!
- •We are to trust Jesus in this wild world.
