 - They had sexual practices that left nothing to the imagination.
- The people were hungry for something more than what their money could buy.
- As they changed their ways, their numbers began to grow.
- The economic core of the city was threatened because so many people came to Christ and began changing their way of living,

Paul

- Paul may have been in prison when he wrote this letter.
- Paul was always careful to remind us that we are saved by grace, and by no other means.
- Paul discovered that through his faith in Christ he could better control his thoughts, his lusts, his anxiety, his anger, and his feelings of guilt.
- Through knowing Christ, Paul found a freedom that allowed him to sing while he was in prison.
