Trouble #1

- Samson might have been going to Timnah for political reasons.
- Samson became attracted to a Philistine woman.
- This was wrong because:
 - Intermarriage with pagans was strictly forbidden in the Law of Moses.
 - There was no indication that she was attracted to him.
 - His parents did not want him to marry a Philistine.
- God allowed Samson to follow his own course.
- Samson was going to accomplish God's will though he did not know it.

Trouble #2

- Samson's parents relented to his wishes and went with him to Timnah.
- Samson faced the first real test of his strength by defeating a lion attack.
- Samson did not tell his parents about his encounter with the lion.
- Samson proposed marriage to the Philistine woman.
- Samson violated his Nazarite vow by eating honey from a dead animal.

The Wedding

- Only Samson's father, came to the wedding.
- Samson gave a feast and asked a riddle about the lion and the honey.
- Samson believed he could outwit the Philistines with his riddle.
- The Philistines would have to provide 30 sets of clothes if they could not figure out the riddle in time.
