Nebuchadnezzar's Statue

- Nebuchadnezzar believed that if he could not earn respect, he could decree respect.
- Nebuchadnezzar struggled with insecurity.
- Insecurity causes conflict and nasty behavior.
- Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego's resolve was in sharp contrast to the insecurity of Nebuchadnezzar.

How Can We Conquer Insecurity

- Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego did not get their security from Nebuchadnezzar.
- Nebuchadnezzar could not offer them true security.
- No matter how much we go along with the irrational demands of others, it will not guarantee our future.
- If Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego had tried to play the king's game, they would have lost.
- Trust God for lasting security.

Commit To What Is Right

- A tentative commitment leads to insecurity.
- A strong commitment to do what is right, no matter what the cost, projects confidence and strength.
- If our commitment to do what is right does not pay off in respect, trust and confidence, we will be secure in the hands of God.
- Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego stood firm in their faith, while Nebuchadnezzar shook with uncontrollable rage.
- Insecurity causes collateral damage.

- Nebuchadnezzar was forced to bow before the God Who is above all.
- God was with Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego in the fire.
- God promises to be with us in times of trouble.
- Because we can trust God to be with us in the fire, we can live with confidence and assurance.
