


He's Got This

Interpretation of the Vision

- Everything fits: the four parts of the Greek empire, the arrogance and cruelty of Antiochus, and the desecration of all that was holy.
- Some people speculate that the book of Daniel was written after the historical events.
- Regardless of when the book of Daniel was written, it was a reflection of God's hand in history.
- Daniel had a unique gift from God to see visions.
- God was fully able to reveal the future to Daniel.

Nothing Is A Surprise To God

- Nothing is a surprise to God, and nothing is beyond His control.
- Daniel's vision reveals that God is in control of all events—even events 300 years later.
- Even though he could see God in control, Daniel could not see how it would all end.
- The destruction of the temple fit into God's plan, as Christianity was no longer centered around the temple in Jerusalem, but the temple of the church universal.
- The destruction of the temple was not the end of life on earth.
- The future might be rough, but the end is glorious!

Conclusion

- We don't need to know how the events of history fit into God's plan.
- What we need to know is that God's plan and purpose will not be frustrated.
- No person, power or movement will take over God's plan and purpose.
- Jesus Christ guarantees the fulfillment of God's plan.
