Gideon's Complaint

- The angel of the Lord called Gideon a mighty warrior.
- Gideon ignored the mighty warrior comment and started complaining.
- God had not abandoned Israel, but Israel had abandoned God.
- God is here more in the bad times because that is where He is able to demonstrate His glory and power.
- God is more serious about healing our heart situation than our bank account.

Gideon's Excuses

- Gideon tried to excuse himself by saying he was the least of the least.
- Just as God saw Gideon as a mighty warrior, He sees us as mighty warriors, too.
- Gideon asked the angel for a sign to prove that he was really God's messenger.
- Gideon knew a sinful person, standing in the presence of a holy God, could not last long.
- Gideon built an altar and named the place The Lord is Peace because it is at that place where he received the peace of God, Who promised He would not destroy him.

Gideon's First Assignment

- Gideon was instructed to tear down the altars to Baal that his father built.
- The people had claimed allegiance to the Jewish God, but they had fallen into idol worship.
- Gideon tore the alters down, but he did it under the cover of night.
- When the people discovered Gideon had destroyed their alters, they come to his house where his father told them, "If Baal is really a god, let him contend for himself."
- Gideon wore the accusations of the people as a badge of honor, because he was someone who was willing to contend with Baal.
- Gideon understood that this was not just any battle but a spiritual battle.

Testing God

- Gideon asked God to provide another sign using a fleece.
- Gideon decided he needed a second sign using the fleece.
- Today, Christians still throw out fleeces for God to help them make tough decisions.
- When God brings in a specific deliverer to do a specific act, He is willing to let that person put out a fleece to confirm that calling.
- If you do put out a fleece, keep in mind that the sign received will never contradict the Word of God.

Gideon's Victory

- God allowed these signs because He expected something more out of Gideon, i.e. He expected him to step out further in faith.
- After Gideon gathered his army, God told him that he had too many troops.
- God narrowed Gideon's army down to 300 men.
- Instead of waiting for Gideon to ask for a sign, God told him to sneak into the Midianite's camp and listen to their conversations.
- Gideon had victory over the Midianites where the odds were 450:1, which demonstrated that he could not have done it without the power of God being behind him.

- Before we can go out into the world to take battle, we must start in our own house and look for things that may be idols.
