- Mercy was important to Peter since, after the resurrection, Jesus sought him out, showing him mercy by forgiveness.
- The last mention of "mercy" in the Old Testament is in Habakkuk with the remembrance of mercy in wrath.
- The first mention of mercy in the New Testament is found in Matthew 5:7 in the Beatitudes.
