- A fool or a cheater was someone who had an acceptable animal but chose to give something less to the Lord.
- We must be aware that we should not offer empty sacrifices, but we should offer the sacrifice of ourselves.

Prayer

- Pagan people believed when they prayed the more words they offered in their prayer, the more likely the god or goddess would hear their prayers.
- Solomon warned that we should hold our tongue a bit when we pray.
- In Solomon's time there was a wall between the people and God.
- Today, we can have a conversational relationship with God.
- We still need to guard our words because, as humans, we tend to speak a lot.
- God already knows what we need before we ask, so we do not have to babble on and on.

Vows

- A vow is a promise to God.
- Vows were common in the temple system during Old Testament times.
- People took vows seriously, because they knew that they had to keep them.
- Today we do not take vows seriously, because if we break them, who really cares.
- Baptism is a vow to be a disciple of Jesus Christ.
- We are all guilty of making empty promises, which are known as the sacrifice of fools.
