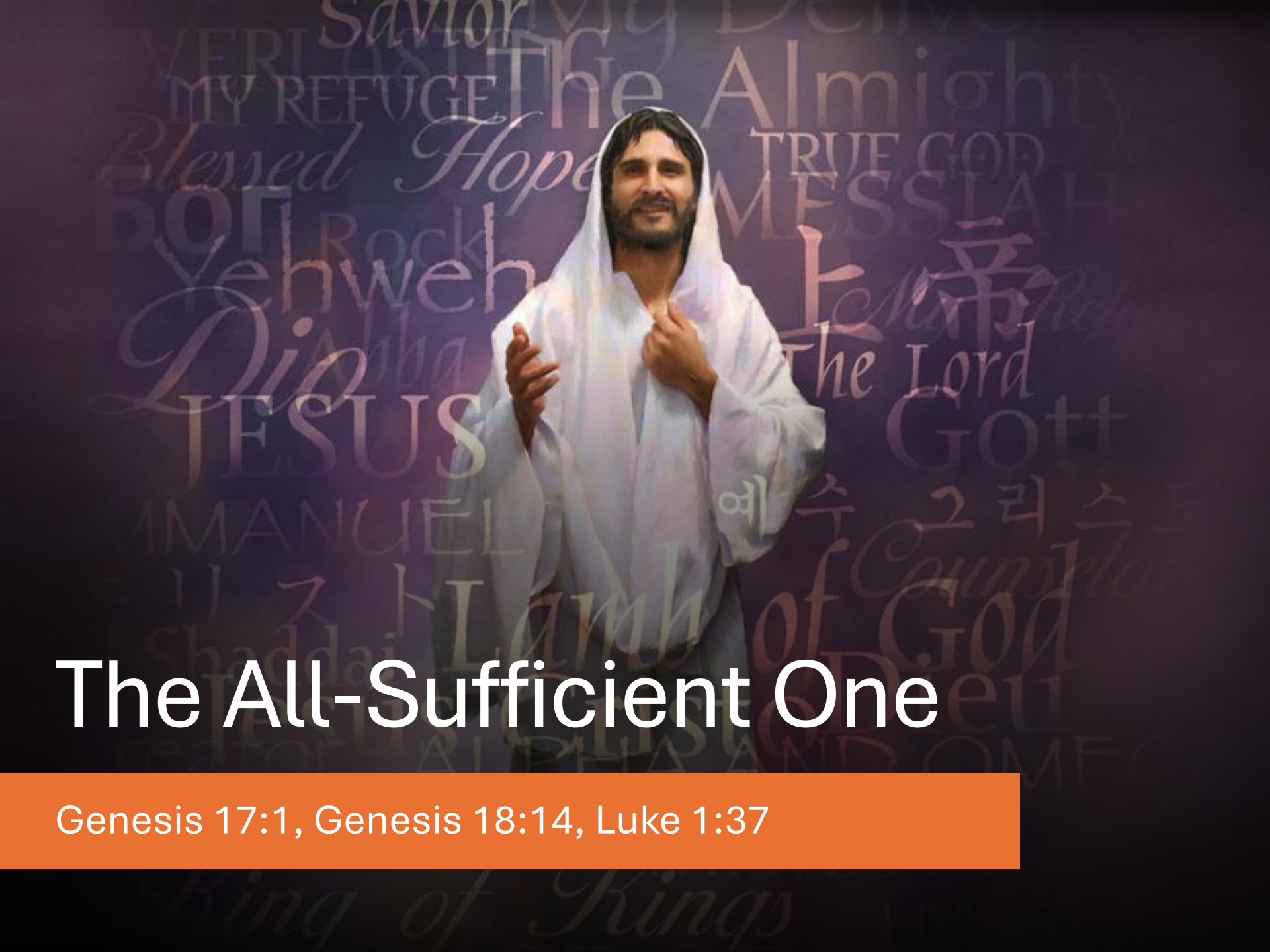

- Our job is not to figure out how God will fulfill His promises, but to trust that El Shaddai has more than enough power to fulfill what He has promised.
