Christian Conduct

- Theology always flows into Christian conduct.
- In the early Church, faith and belief were not separated from obedience and conduct.
- There is a concerted push to separate private faith from public conduct.
- Today, there is a growing tendency to draw a dividing line between our private faith and beliefs and our public life and obedience.

Importance of Identity

- Peter told the ancient believers that they were a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, and a people for God's own possession.
- Our behavior and our identity are linked.
- Calling yourself a Christian does not make you a Christian.
- We are who God declares us to be.

All For A Purpose

- **Testifying to our identity is for one purpose and one purpose alone.**
- **We are to proclaim the excellencies of Him who called us out of darkness into His marvelous light.**
- **Our calling is for the purpose of us proclaiming God's glory.**
- **Our Christian behavior is not so others will notice us, but so that others would notice Him!**

Conclusion

- God's calling to salvation is for us to bring Him glory.
- The majestic life for which Jesus has chosen us, is a life that calls attention to His glory and majesty.
