Commitment

- Since commitment can be hard, we should be careful to what we commit ourselves.
- The Christian life is a life of commitment.
- Understanding Christian commitment requires understanding what the Bible has to say about the Christian life.
- There is not a single verse in the Scriptures that we can study and say, *“This is what Christian commitment means.”*

Discipleship

- The Christian life is a commitment to being Jesus' disciple.
- Discipleship involves discipline and structure.
- Jesus' call is always a call to discipleship.
- Jesus' disciples are granted things that no one else is.

Faithfulness

- **Faithfulness is about a life of faith and keeping the Faith.**
- **Faithfulness is about staying true to the teachings of the Word of God.**
- **We live the Christian life because we believe, and not because we are under some sort of obligation.**
- **The rewards of the Kingdom are given to those who are faithful.**

Endurance

- Endurance means that over the course of our Christian walk, we have developed staying power.
- The idea of “endurance” in the New Testament is that we stay committed when everyone else turns back.
- Endurance means you stay, you last, and you endure in it all and through it all.

Conclusion

- **Those who endure will be saved in the end.**
- **Christian commitment means endurance.**
- **Commitment to Christ and His Kingdom is a commitment that is revealed in our discipleship, our faithfulness, and our endurance.**
