Sharing by Caring

Galatians 5:14, "Love your neighbor as yourself."

The young pastor prayed every morning, asking God to use him that day to bless someone. Often, to his delight, such a situation arose. One day during a break at his second job, he sat in the sunshine with a coworker who asked him about Jesus. The pastor simply answered the other man's questions. No rant. No arguing. The pastor commented that being guided by the Holy Spirit led him to have a casual talk that felt effective but loving. He made a new friend as well—someone hungry to learn more about God.

Letting the Holy Spirit lead us is the best way to tell others about Jesus. He told His disciples, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses" (Acts 1:8).

The fruit of the Spirit "is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23). Living under the Spirit's control, that young pastor put into practice what Peter instructed: "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect" (1 Peter 3:15).

Even if we suffer for believing in Christ, our words can show the world that His Spirit leads us. Then our walk will draw others to Him.

As requested, a Texans on Mission strike team is on the ground in the Los Angeles area working with partner churches to meet needs of



people affected by the Southern California wildfires. To-

Working through these church partners, the strike team is discovering ways to meet expanded physical, emotional and spiritual needs. The weight of the fire literally hangs in the air everywhere these families turn. "The situation here is heavy," said Rand Jenkins, a member of the team. The Measure Of Our Prayers

1 Thessalonians 5:17, Matthew 21:13, Hebrews 13:3, 1 Corinthians 10:31, Matthew 6:6

God Will Measure Our Prayers

- •It is God's desire that we pray without ceasing.
- •Every believer has the God given ability to pray.
- •We are to pray to our Father in heaven.
- •Out of all that He could have done, Jesus chose to spend His final hours in prayer.
- •Every believer is called to pray.
- •God cannot answer a prayer that has not been prayed.

Deciding To Pray

- •You either choose to pray, or you choose not to pray; the decision is yours to make.
- Our failure to pray has serious eternal consequences.
- •God will not force you to pray.
- •It takes faith to believe that when nothing seems to be happening, God is still working

on your behalf.

- •There will come a day when Jesus will look into our heart and measure our lives by our prayers.
- •Prayer is so powerful that it allows you to reach every nation on earth.

The Width, Depth, Height, And Length Of Our Prayers

- •Do your prayers go beyond your wants and needs?
- •As you pray, make sure your prayers are wide enough to include the whole world and all that God gives you to pray.
- •Measure your prayers by the depth of your burden for those whom God has placed on your heart.
- •Measure your prayer life by the height of your prayers that truly touch heaven.
- •God will measure your prayers by their length; the eternal results that will never end.
- •Every Christian can add to the width, and depth, and height, and length of their prayers, by being consistent in praying a little every



day.

The Decision To Pray

- •The first step to developing a prayer life that will impact eternity is to decide to pray.
- •In choosing to pray, you must have a plan.
- •Make time to pray as prayer takes time, effort, and discipline.
- •Ask the Holy Spirit to teach you how to pray.
- •When you pray, believe that God will answer your prayer.
- •When God answers your prayer, stop whatever you are doing, and immediately give God all the glory and thanks.

Conclusion

- •God is calling all of us to a life of prayer, but it is your decision.
- •When you measure your life for prayer:
- ⇒Measure it by the number of unsaved souls you pray for.
- ⇒Measure it by the number of pastors and ministries you pray for.
- ⇒Measure it by the number of nations God

gives you to pray for.

- ⇒Measure your life by praying for our brothers and sisters who are suffering persecution and imprisonment for their faith.
- ⇒Measure your life by the extent that you make the time to pray.
- ⇒Measure your life by the width of your prayers, by the depth of your prayers, by the height of your prayers, and by the length of your prayers.
- ⇒Measure your life with a heart that so loves God, that you desire to be with Him in prayer.
- •Remember, God cannot answer a prayer that is not prayed.
